The school division stretches along both sides of the Red River, from the southern suburban communities of Lockport and St. Andrews, through the farming areas of Clandeboye, Petersfield and Libau, to the lakeshore communities of Grand Marais and Victoria Beach on Lake Winnipeg. The Division office is located in the City of Selkirk.

The Division comprises fifteen (15) schools and one (1) learning centre that offers alternative and adult learning programming.
