Developing Agile Teacher Teams

Teacher teams are the engine room for system-wide improvements in equity and quality. In order for 'macro reform' efforts to be successful, they need to enable educator teams at the frontline to work through the micro-reform processes of redesigning learning to cause learning. System and school improvement policies often underperform, because they do not meaningfully impact the daily work and classroom practices of teachers. In this session we will review our systemic approaches to teacher learning and development, and explore the potential for the Agile Schools 'learning sprints' approach to offer a fruitful path for accelerated improvement.

Harnessing Agile Improvement: Focusing for Impact, Reviewing the Evidence

One of the most important questions that an agile leader can ask is: Where can we make the biggest impact for our learners? During this session we will explore how system leaders can maximise their impact by relentlessly focusing on a few areas for improvement. We will review the current portfolio of improvement initiatives operating across districts and consider which ones are providing the most impact for our investment. After considering the evidence we will explore the key questions of 1) what should we continue 2) what should we stop and 3) what should we tweak for greater impact.
